

Associational Missionary Messages

"Hatred stirs up strife, but love covers all offenses." - Proverbs 10:12

A spiritual battle wages within our hearts. Hatred seeks to stir up strife and causes us to seek revenge upon those who we perceive have offended us. Love is the opposite because it forgives and seeks to cover all offenses. A fierce storm between hatred and love occurs within us. God urges us to choose love and reject hate. Hatred starts a fire that is fierce; but love pours gentle waters upon the flames to calm and extinguish the blaze. In the darkest valleys of our hearts, malice seeks to lead us astray on the path of revenge. But the beacon of love shines high and encourages us to forgive like God has forgiven us. Hatred will build a fortress of spite if we do not resist it. But love still has the power to breach its walls and to cover all offenses. Love whispers a sweet, godly melody that is pure. The bridge of love unites our souls and paves the way for a better tomorrow. So let us choose the path of love and reject the way of hatred. For love is the way of God and of His children.

This passage teaches us the power of love and the danger of hate. It is a simple statement, but one with profound implications for our lives. When we allow hatred to control our lives, we seek revenge instead of pursuing love. Yet when we choose to love, it "covers all offenses."

Early in my ministry, I heard about a distressing event that occurred in a small town north of where I lived. The pastor and a deacon of a particular church were not getting along. Their relationship became quite adversarial. One day, the pastor and the deacon were driving on the same dirt road, approaching one another from opposite directions. Neither the pastor nor the deacon would pull over so the other could pass. They both stopped their cars, got out of their vehicles, and started fighting in the middle of the road. Their hatred for one another stirred up strife, but it also brought embarrassment to the church and reproach to the gospel. Problems arise when we refuse to let go of animosity. When we hate, our negative emotions and thoughts spill over into our interactions with others. Hatred spreads like a cancer in our hearts and can kill what is positive in us. It will gain control over us if we allow it; however, love is the opposite. It enables us to overlook the faults of others and gives us the mercy to forgive.

The best example of the covering power of love is the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross of Calvary. The love of Jesus led Him to cover all our offenses through His atonement for sins.

Love brings people together and strengthens relationships. Love mends broken relationships and fosters trust. Being loved is like being enfolded in a warm, secure blanket. By modeling love and forgiveness, we share the love of God with those around us. By choosing love, we transform our lives and the lives of those around us.

CSI: Camp Christian

God truly showed out at Camp Christian this year! We had a wonderful week of camp, learning about "**CSI**: Camp Christian – **C**onstant **S**cripture Investigation." While we feared that our numbers would be small because camp was held over the 4th of July, we were pleasantly surprised.



• Youth camp (July 3 – 6) was only a little smaller than normal with 37 youth and 7 adults in attendance. The pastors who preached and taught classes did an amazing job and really helped our youth learn how to apply our camp memory verse for the week:

"Study to show yourself approved, a workman who need not be ashamed, rightly dividing the Word of Truth." 2 Timothy 2:15

We had several youth who asked questions about salvation and rededication.

Children's Camp (July 6 – 9) was a wonderful surprise. While we thought numbers would be down, we had the largest Children's Camp we have ever held, with 81 children attending. We also selected and trained 16 youth to serve as Junior Leaders. Their role was to serve as teachers for our 5 classes, to lead recreational activities, and to serve as cabin leaders for the children. The Lord did a mighty work, and 16 children came forward to accept Jesus as their Lord and Savior. One interesting point to note is that 14 to these children were led by Junior Leaders as they came forward to accept Jesus. Our pastors who provided the evening worship experience did a wonderful job of preaching on our children's levels, bringing the Word with power and might.


We are indebted to the adults who assisted with camp this year. We had 11 adults who spent nights in camp with us. It is a sacrifice for these adults to take a week out of their busy schedule to spend time at Camp Christian. We are also grateful for the churches that provided meals, snacks, drinks, scholarships, and other support. We can proudly say that every church in the Ebenezer Baptist Association participated in some way or another with Camp Christian this year. We could not hold Camp Christian without the continued financial and prayer support from each of our churches.

One other important note to make about Camp Christian this year has to do with our theme – **C**onstant **S**cripture Investigation: **CSI** – Camp Christian. Each year, campers spend time each morning doing Quiet Time Bible Study activities. One of these activities is to memorize a selected Bible verse each day. They are also asked to memorize the Camp Christian Theme Verse (this year, II Timothy 2:15). We are thankful to say that every youth and every child at camp memorized these specific verses and recited them to a leader. We know that if we can put Scripture into their hearts, the Holy Spirit can bring it to mind at the appropriate time (John 14: 26). This is only a small portion of what our youth and children learned about the Lord, His Word, and how to serve Him in their lives.

Again, thank you so much for your continued and enthusiastic support of Camp Christian. We truly believe that we are preparing the next generation of leaders in our churches through camp activities, worship experiences, and the Junior Leader program. God continues to do a mighty work through Camp Christian, and we give Him all the praise and glory for all that is accomplished. We look forward to next year as we get ready for our 17th camp season – July 8 – 14, 2024.

October:





This summer we also had to replace our roof, and we are in the process of having our steeple refurbished.


We are planning a revival with projected dates of October 19-21.
